30215QLD – Course in General Safety Induction (Construction Industry) *Blue Card*

What career options do I have?

Completion of the program meets the generic health and safety requirements to be employed on a construction site for construction type work or a prescribed activity such as removal of asbestos materials at a workplace.

What will I learn?

This course is intended to provide new and existing building and construction industry participants with the introductory understanding and knowledge needed to commence or continue work in the building and construction industry. Participants will receive the necessary Workplace Health and Safety Ticket (also referred to as the "Blue Card") required for site access.

What qualification will I receive?

Statement of Attainment for competencies achieved.

Where will I train?

Mount Isa, Lower Gulf, Cloncurry, On-Line or remotely.

How long will the training take?

4 -5 hours.

How will the training take place?

Training can take place in a formal classroom setting or on-line. If participants are in a remote location a package can be sent out to allow students to complete the course.

What assessment methods will be used?

Groups of more participants will have the advantage of face to face delivery in a class room setting. You will have to complete a risk assessment, answer questions relating to MSDS and safety legislation.

Individual participants will complete the course and assessment on-line in a supervised environment e.g. TAFE library.

Am I eligible?

Prior to enrolment consider contacting the Client Information Centre to discuss your personal preferences for training outcomes. Your call will assist in matching your preferences to entry and exit points in a qualification. Consideration will be given to your academic and/or work histories.

Is what I already know taken into account?

Yes. Your history of study, skills and experience does matter. Consideration is given to your life and work experiences as well as formal and informal training. This may be applied using the national standard for Mutual Recognition or through Recognition of Prior learning (RPL). Documentary evidence will be requested.

Where a participant has a Statement of Attainment for BCGCM1001B they will be required to demonstrate an understanding of relevant Queensland legislation as specified in the evidence guide for GSIBC001B.

When can I start?/How do I apply?

Contact the Client Information Centre for the latest course commencement dates and enrolment details.

Students will be required to bring photo identification to obtain their Blue Card.

Can I go onto further training?

You may gain recognition of your studies towards higher level training in this field.

Is there anything I need to bring?

A notebook and pen would be beneficial.

What else might I find useful?

Financial assistance with fees may be available through concessions, or via 'Time to Pay' payment plan. This and other information such as Student Support, Study and Library Assistance, Student Responsibilities, is found in the Mount Isa Institute of TAFE Student Guide/ Handbook.
