Accredited Short Course – Elevating Work Platform

What career options do I have?

This ticket can give you opportunities to gain employment in the construction, civil construction and mining industries.

What will I learn?

The workplace health and safety obligations required to operate this plant equipment; the skills and underpinning knowledge required to achieve ticketing outcome through the Division of Workplace Health and Safety.

What qualification will I receive?

You will receive a Result of Assessment for OHSCER235A – Operate a Boom Type Elevating Work Platform and an EWP ticket issued by the Division of Workplace Health and Safety.

Where will I train?

Training will be conducted at Mount Isa Institute of TAFE and approved off-site job placements.

How long will the training take?

The duration of this training is three (3) days in total at TAFE and 40-80 hours in the workplace.

How will the training take place?

Training will consist of three (3) days study at TAFE to complete theory and practical lessons, 40-80 hours in the workplace and returning to TAFE afterwards to complete final assessments.

What assessment methods will be used?

Assessment methods will include Written & Practical and a final practical challenge test.

Is there anything I need to bring?

Photographic identification, notebook and pen.

Do I need training resources?

Mount Isa Institute of TAFE will provide Learning guides, and a Division of Workplace Health and Safety approved log book.

Am I eligible?

To receive a ticket through the Division of Workplace Health and Safety, you must be 18 years and over.

Is what I already know taken into account?

Yes. Your history of study, skills and experience does matter. Consideration is given to your life and work experiences as well as formal and informal training. Documentary evidence such as a log book will be requested. However, you will then be required to complete the theory and practical assessments.

When can I start?/How do I apply?

Contact the Client Information Centre for the latest course commencement dates and enrolment details. Subject to minimum class numbers.

What are the enrolment fees?

To find out what fees are applicable, please request a quotation from the Client Information Centre.

What else might I find useful?
