



Accredited Short Course – Forklift Ticketing

What career options do I have?

By obtaining this ticket, you will open up career opportunities in the mining and warehousing industries.

What will I learn?

The workplace health and safety obligations on operating this plant equipment and the skills and knowledge required to achieve ticketing of this equipment through the Division of Workplace Health and Safety.

What qualification will I receive?

You will receive a Statement of Attainment and a Forklift Ticket which will be issued through the Division of Workplace Health & Safety.

Where will I train?

Training will be conducted at Mount Isa Institute of TAFE and approved off-site job placements.

How long will the training take?

The duration of this training is 3 days at TAFE and 40 hours in the workplace.

How will the training take place?

Training will consist of 2 days training at TAFE for theory and practical work, 40 hours experience in the workplace and another day at TAFE to complete the final assessment.

What if I don't have access to a forklift to practice?

TAFE will be able to arrange vocational placement for you.

What assessment methods will be used?

Assessment methods will include Written & Practical and a final practical challenge test.

Is there anything I need to bring?

Photographic identification, notebook and pen.

Do I need training resources?

Mount Isa Institute of TAFE will provide Learning guides, and a Division of Workplace Health and Safety approved log book.

Am I eligible?

To receive a ticket through the Division of Workplace Health and Safety, you must be 18 years and over.

Is what I already know taken into account?

Yes. Your history of study, skills and experience does matter. Consideration is given to your life and work experiences as well as formal and informal training. This may be applied using the national standard for Mutual Recognition or through Recognition of Prior learning (RPL). Documentary evidence will be requested. In addition, as part of the RPL process you will be required to complete a mandatory challenge test.

RPL interviews will be held every second Wednesday night between 5pm – 9pm. Please contact Paul Buckley on 0427 163 221 to make an appointment.

When can I start?/How do I apply?

Contact the Client Information Centre for the latest course commencement dates and enrolment details. **Subject to minimum class numbers.**

What are the enrolment fees?

The cost to complete this course is:

Note: Fees must be paid to the Client Information Centre at least 24 hours prior to attending class.
