### 30239QLD – Conduct In-Service Safety Inspection & Testing of Electrical Equipment (Test & Tag)

#### What career options do I have?

Become competent in testing and tagging electrical equipment in accordance with the *Electrical Safety Regulations 2002*.

#### What will I learn?

Areas covered in the program include planning for inspection, inspecting and testing electrical equipment, action inspection and test results.

Upon completion of this course, the learner will be able to carry out the function of testing and tagging in-service electrical equipment of the business in which they are employed.

#### What qualification will I receive?

A Statement of Attainment for competencies achieved. The number that will be issued on your award will be used for the licence number when testing and tagging.

#### Where will I train?

As this course is delivered on-line, attendees can either attend either Mount Isa, Cloncurry or Lower Gulf campuses and use the computer facilities, or learn from the comfort of your own home by accessing the secure, web based and password protected delivery and assessment.

This course will also have a practical (hands-on) assessment (approximately 1 hour) to be conducted at Mount Isa or Cloncurry or at your place of business.

Practical assessments may be available at the Lower Gulf campus (Normanton) but will be subject to minimum numbers.

#### How long will the training take?

The duration of study will depend on how quickly or slowly you would like to progress – there is a 3 month limit on enrolments.

#### How will the training take place?

On-line via a secure, web based and password protected delivery and assessment system – and hands on practical 1 hour assessment.

#### What assessment methods will be used?

There is both a theory and a practical assessment. The theory component is completed online and must be successfully completed before the student is eligible for the practical assessment. The Practical assessment will be conducted on a one-to-one basis and will cover the essential practical requirements of physically testing and tagging a range of safe and unsafe electrical appliances.

#### Is there anything I need to bring?

Since the student will be using their own/company's test equipment, it would be advisable that they bring that test equipment along for the practical assessment.

#### Am I eligible?

Entry into this training program will be limited to those employed or intending to be employed to carry out testing and tagging procedures on a routine basis so that currency of competency is maintained.

#### Is what I already know taken into account?

Yes. Your history of study, skills and experience does matter. Consideration is given to your life and work experiences as well as formal and informal training. This may be applied using the national standard for Mutual Recognition or through Recognition of Prior learning (RPL). Documentary evidence will be requested.

#### When can I start? / How do I apply?

Contact the Client Information Centre for the latest course commencement dates and enrolment details.

#### What else might I find useful?

Financial assistance with fees may be available through concessions, or via 'Time to Pay' payment plan. This and other information such as Student Support, Study and Library Assistance, Student Responsibilities, is found in the Mount Isa Institute of TAFE Student Guide/ Handbook.
